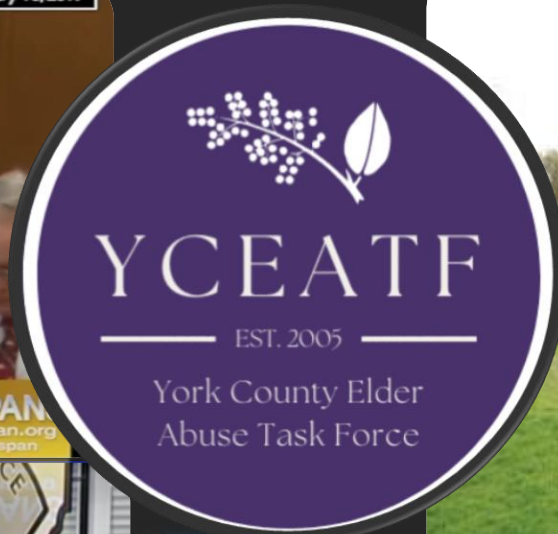

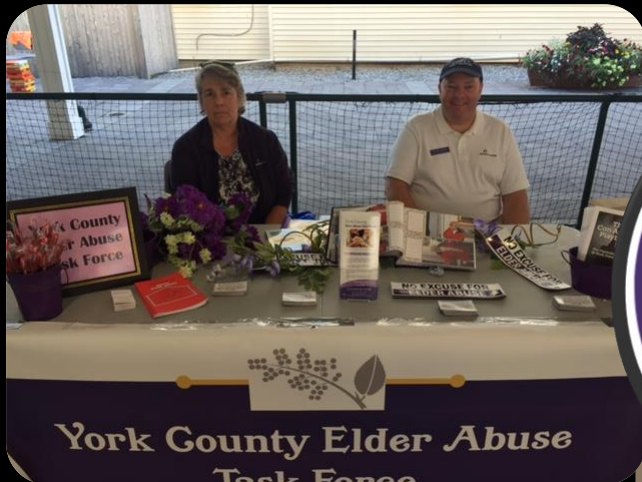

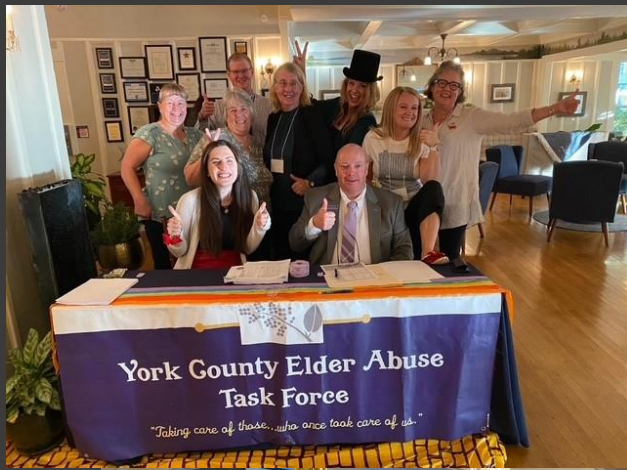
We come together to share our knowledge and skills, to serve as a resource to educate the public about elder abuse, and ultimately eliminate it as a problem someday.

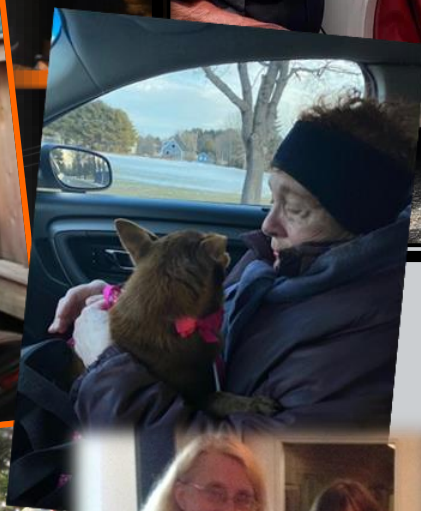

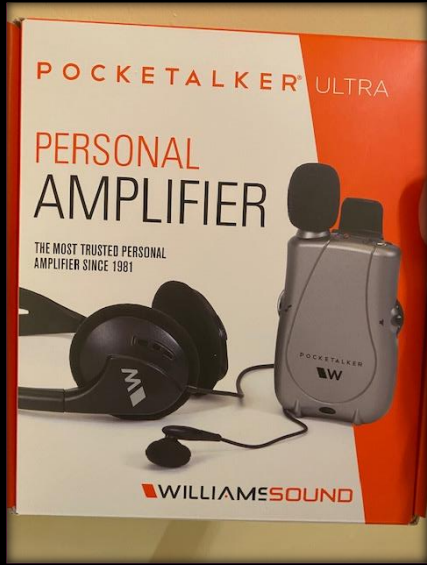
We as a task force are proud to be a part of and have developed many innovative and nationally recognized activities surrounding our elders including this annual scholarship award.

Covid-19 has impacted our lives in many ways and we want to help our communities back to the implications of the pandemic.

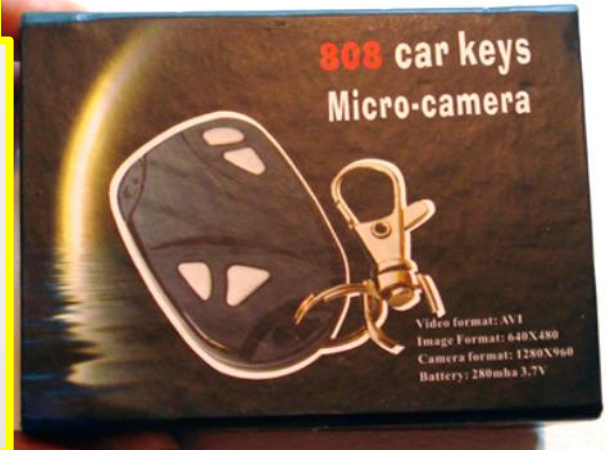

Attendees will also receive a bag of shelf stable items to keep at home. Come mingle with community members, professionals and leave with knowledge, friends and giveaways!

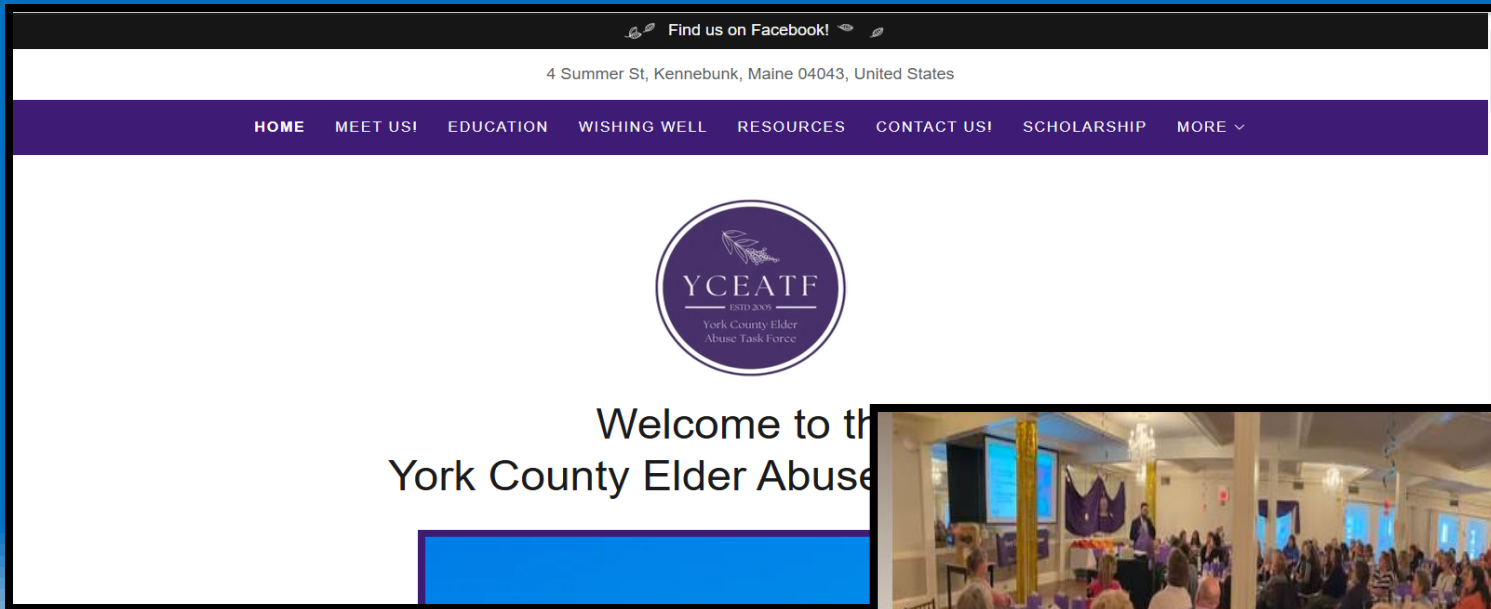
