

Chief Andrew Booth, Bath Police Department

Chief Andrew Booth has been with the Bath Police Department since 2002, having served in both patrol and criminal investigations, and was promoted through the ranks until being named Chief in 2021. His responsibilities as a police chief include memberships on a variety of City and community groups and committees; many of these focused on issues affecting older adults (Bath Brunswick Resource Coalition and Merrymeeting Bay Area TRIAD organization). He currently serves as the co-chair of the Maine Council for Elder Abuse Prevention (MCEAP), sits on MCEAP's Education and Awareness sub-committee that plans and executes two major state-wide Elder Abuse training events annually, and is also a member of the State's Elder Justice Coordinating Partnership (EJCP). In 2024, he attended the National Elder Justice Law Enforcement Summit held in Washington, D.C.

Chief Booth is a graduate of St. Michael's College in Vermont, where he received a bachelor's degree in history and a minor in business administration. He is a member of the Maine Chiefs of Police Association, the International Association of Chiefs of Police, and holds an Executive Level Law Enforcement certificate from the Maine Criminal Justice Academy. He is also a senior member of the Maine Law Enforcement Accreditation Program, serving as both an accreditation assessor, accreditation manager, and committee member. In addition to his civilian career, he served 24 years in the VT Army National Guard, retiring in 2022 as a Lieutenant Colonel, Infantry, with an additional specialty in Information Operations. He is a veteran of two combat deployments to Afghanistan, a graduate of the Army's Command and General Staff College and has held multiple command and staff positions during his Army career.

Gina Googins, LSW, MSW has worked as a Social Worker for the past 31 years. Gina started her career as a Child Protective Caseworker and was promoted into several Child Welfare positions including Manager for OCFS Title IV-E Program, District Office Manager, Program Manager for the Training and Policy Program and in 2015 became the Regional Associate Director, overseeing several child welfare district offices and programs. In April 2024, Gina became the Associate Director for Adult Protective Services and Public Guardianship within the Office of Aging and Disabilities. Gina obtained her Master of Social Work Degree from the University of Maine and is a Licensed Social Worker. She is a constant learner and teacher, especially when it comes to working with people to find solutions to complex issues. Gina is continuously motivated to enhance and improve not only herself, but also those people and programs that she collaborates with.
